Dear Sir:

As director of UNRRA in Shanghai, I know you are taking interest in helping the distressed. I am, therefore, appealing to you and hope that you will take personal interest in helping my son.

Five years ago, when the world murderer, Hitler, and his bandits occupied the most part of Europe and Poland was under their rule, my son, Samuel E. Taub, escaped from Warsaw, leaving behind, his wife and his nine-year old child. He escaped and reached Japan where he received affidavits from me. On the 7th of December, 1941, when our country declared war on Japan, he was kept a civil prisoner of the Japanese.

My two sons entered the United States Army and one of them, after one year's service has been honorably discharged. The other one has been in the Armed Forces for four years and was wounded and has received honorable citations.

Now my son, Samuel E. Taub, who is at present located at

119 Wayside Road,
Shanghai, China,

is there all by himself. His wife and only child were murdered by the Hitlerites. I, as well as my children residing in America, have taken all the necessary steps to have my son join us in America, where he will receive a home after going through all these hardships.

The American Consulate at Shanghai has promised my son an American Immigration Visa if he could only submit evidence that he has a place on a steamer that will bring him to America. I am, therefore, appealing to you, kind friend, as director of UNRRA,
