Yiddish

Etymology

From Middle High German *welisc* (“foreign”), from Old High German *walask*, *walahisk*, *welisk*, from Proto-Germanic **walhiskaz*. The script was referred to as “foreign” because it was traditionally used by the Sephardim, rather than by the Ashkenazim.

Adjective

וועליש • (velish)

- of or related to the Vellish script, the most common typeface for printed Hebrew and the Sephardi Stam script from which the typeface is derived
